Transportation Update



As you can imagine, transportation is one of our biggest expenses for the Contingent, and Committee Member **Eric Hoadley** has been working diligently to get our transportation in place for the trip. One item we've learned since previous Jamborees (and since our November meeting) is that our local bus providers are no longer allowing overnight driving between midnight and 5 a.m.

This means our busses will depart earlier on July 18th, with an overnight stop on the way.

Details are still being ironed out, but we're expecting a departure between 9 and 10 am on July 18, 2023 instead of the evening departure we may have mentioned. At this point we don't expect an overnight stay on the way home. We'll have all the details at the March meeting, but we wanted you to be aware so you could plan early!


Watch Your Email for AHMR Information

You should be receiving reminder emails to submit health information electronically. The email subject is "Please Submit Your National Scout Jamboree Health History." Check your junk folder if you haven't seen it yet. That email includes all necessary links and codes for the forms (AHMR parts A, B, C) and the Jamboree Risk Advisory Form. Please carefully read the instructions regarding electronic submittal. We recommend completing electronic submittal by the end of April. Paper Copies of all AHMR parts are due to your Contingent Leaders at the March 12 Parent and Participant Meeting!



Congratulations to our Patch Design winners!

Joe Matthews designed our collector/trading patch set featuring the story of how W. D. Boyce discovered Scouting and brought it to America. While lost in the fog he was helped by the unknown Scout, who refused payment for his good deed. An intrigued Boyce went to the Scout Headquarters to learn more about this program, bringing materials back to the USA where he worked to make it the huge success it is today. This patch set will have a limited run of only 100 patches.

Kayla Gilliland, Troop 1957, Hudson, designed our contingent patch set featuring sites associated with Illinois. The surrounding Contingent Shoulder Patches (CSP's) will depict our state symbols along with iconic IL Route 66 locations.

To bring the theme together, the Council Shoulder Patches (CSP's) are arrayed around a patch shaped like our home State of Illinois. On this patch we have a beautiful Midwestern summer day. These bright and colorful patches are sure to be a hit.

Each of these CSP's will be utilized by one of the five groups attending the Jamboree from our council: Venture Crew, two Troops, Staff, and one for trading.
