## **Cub Scouts**

### Building on what we introduced last year:

- Plan your Scout Talks and School Nights for Scouting with your District Executive using 12-Step plan.
- Council will print flyers and provide yard signs, DEs will give Scout Talks
- Special Facebook geofencing offer:
  - Council will set up for your School Night for Scouting and MATCH the first \$50 of the cost.
  - Sign up at the same time you complete your SNFS planning form



### **Cub Scouts**

#### Additionally:

- Reach out to Cub Scouts "lost" during COVID.
  - District professional will provide you with contact lists of former Cub Scouts who are still within the age range of Cub Scouts
  - No rejoining fee!
- Plan "NFAs" (Normal Friend Activities)
  - Low-pressure events where kids and families can have fun, mingle with current Cub Scouts and their families
  - Fun for your pack, but also provides a welcoming environment for new families
- Mixed-gender Dens
  - Piloted last year nationally and in our council, now officially approved.
  - Especially helpful when single-gender dens are too small, short of adult leaders.

### **Scouts BSA**

#### We need a renewed emphasis!

#### Can't count on cross-overs

- Engage PLC and other older Scouts in planning and executing recruiting.
- Make sure that you engage and retain new Scouts from last spring
- Utilize NFA events
- First campouts can be critical to retention!
- Make sure your BeAScout pin is accurate and up-to-date.



### **Scouts BSA**

#### Additionally:

- Reach out to Cub Scouts "lost" during COVID who are now Scouts BSA age.
  - District professional will provide you with contact lists of former Cub Scouts
  - Also no rejoining fee!
- Keep in mind that recruiting is not about convincing those who are interested, but finding and welcoming those who ARE!
- It's never too late to be a Scout
  - Don't have to have been a Cub Scout
  - It's NOT all about making Eagle great experiences are possible without making Eagle.
- Scouts and sports CAN co-exist!
  - Demonstrate the flexibility to be welcoming when they can be there, understanding when they can't.

### **Membership Fees**

#### **Effective August 1:**

- National kept increase to \$5
- No change to joining fee
- No change to charter fee (\$100)
- Council keeping program fee at \$28
- Prorated fees eliminated
- Fees for new members will be based on joining date
- Fees for existing members will be based on recharter month
- Adult volunteer fee increasing to \$60 due to increasing cost of
- Insurance and enhanced background checks
- Merit Badge Counselor (if only role): \$25
